Introduction

44996 screenings done, 5486 spectacles prescribed by Ratna Nidhi in 2022-23 for underprivileged students in Mumbai. With the onset of mobile phones, computers, and now education also slowly shifting to online mode, the stress on the eyes is much larger than before. Students tend to watch videos, study online sometime in the dark, increasing stress on eyes. About 15-20% of students in schools need vision correction.

Vision correction especially for students is critical as it has a direct impact on studying and understanding academic concepts. Good vision is directly related to learning. Most of what children learn in school is through visual presentation and when they cannot see a book or blackboard clearly, they struggle to reach their academic potential. Regular eye check- up, and vision correction is one of the most basic, and critical requirement to study.

Project Need

A survey carried out by JJ Hospital and the state's Health Department, which covered 7.5 lakh students across public and private schools from south Mumbai to Sion, found 91,000 kids suffer from myopia. The parents of many of them were not aware of this issue. The survey carried out under the Union Government sponsored Sarva Shiksha Abhiyaan found out that 71000 students with eye defects were exposed to mobile phones.

This situation has increased drastically after the COVID pandemic when the increase in eye issues has been drastic. There is an alarming increase in the number of cases of myopia reported in kids below 12 years of age. On an average, 23-30 per cent kids in India are affected with Myopia, especially kids residing in urban areas as they are seen spending less time outside under sunlight. High exposure to TV, mobile, computer screens and other digital devices, affects children's eyesight majorly.

- 2) More than Forty Four Thousand Nine Hundred students are now **assured** that their vision is corrected and can now focus on academics.

Execution Process

(i) Coordination with Schools

A phone call was made to each school to confirm if the eye check-up camp was needed. Post this, a visit to each school was done to confirm the date. A formal letter was given to each school by Ratna Nidhi personnel.

During the visit, Ratna Nidhi staff held a formal meeting with the Principal. This included finalisation of date, checking the room for vision check-up, checking the light in the room and discussing deliverables during the camp- like- having volunteer teachers to manage the students, proper plug points in the room, student list to be submitted prior to the camp, POC on the day of the camp. All these were important elements for the success of the camp.

(ii) Finalisation of camp date

After this, a confirmation from the School Principal was sought & the camp date in each school was finalised.

(iii) Eye Check-up camp organised

The camp was held in the respective school. A team of 2 professional & experienced optometrists conducted eye check-up camp in each school along with RNCT staff. Ratna Nidhi has bought the eye check-up machines to ensure seamless vision screening.

(iv) Spectacle manufacturing

Once the visit was done, the list from the school was received, and the manufacturing of the spectacles was started. Each spectacle is customised as per the vision no. of the student. Upon packing, each spectacle is labelled with name of the school name, name of student, standard, vision no. and gender. All the spectacles were manufactured in Ratna Nidhi.

(v) Sending the spectacles

The spectacles were then sent to schools through couriers or we fast agency.






Figure 18 Shremati Shantabai School


Figure 20 Mahatma Phule Vidyalaya
