# Real Stories of Covid Survivors from Gujarat & Maharashtra who survived due to timely supply of Oxygen Concentrators

#### 1. Savitaben Bhavanji Thakor, 60 years



COVID-19 has affected millions of families across the globe. One such family was from Bundia, Gujarat in India. Savitaben Bhavanji Thakor is a 60-year-old female, who is uneducated but works in a farm as a laborer. There are eight members in the family. The annual income of the family is only fifty thousand rupees. Savitaben reported that she was having difficulty in breathing and had fever and was continuously coughing. As it is

pandemic, she did a RT-PCR test Unfortunately, she was detected positive for COVID-19. Her symptoms also started worsening. Which in turn led to panic in her home. She had difficulty in breathing. Hence, she was hospitalized. She felt extremely uncomfortable. There was lot of discomfort while breathing. Breathlessness made her more anxious. It was found that her oxygen level had dropped drastically. So doctors put her on oxygen concentrator. She was admitted at Madana Pvt at Dhuva, wherein she received good care and oxygen from oxygen concentrator provided by Ratna Nidhi. She received meals, snacks like biscuits, juice. She was admitted 12 days at Dhuva. She survived and overcome Corona. She is very relieved and happy that she got best treatment. She said that, "I am thankful to god and doctors for saving me from this illness. If I had not got oxygen on time, I would have been dead".

# 2. Vijaben Waghuji, 30 years



Vijaben Waghuji is a 30 years old woman. She lives in Gujarat Nayat with her family. There are four members in her family including herself. She is uneducated but helps her husband in farming. The family income is around six thousand.

When she got diagnosed positive with COVID-19, she and her family were devastated by the news. They thought that is the end of their family and now they will never see their mom and wife again. Her family members wept a lot. Everyone were scared. She was afraid that she will die soon.

She was kept at Dhuva facility. Wherein she was treated there for three days. She got better and then was discharged. She is thankful that she got the treatment and oxygen on time which helped her to recover soon. She is not vaccinated yet. But soon will get a dose for herself and her family.

#### 3.Khemaji, 50 years



When Khemaji got COVID-19 positive her family was extremely distressed by the news. Khemaji Dharsangji Thakor lives in Deesa taluka, who is a fifty-year-old woman. She is married and there are five members in her family. Her husband works as a laborer and earns rupees five thousand monthly.

Her family was anxious. When her reports were positive for COVID-19, all her family members got scared and were worried.

She was admitted to Dhuva facility and received very good treatment. She was at Dhuva facility for four days. Her initial symptoms were fever, cough and shortness of breath. Due to shortness of breath she was given oxygen for few days from Ratna Nidhi's oxygen concentrator. After few days her condition got stable and she was able to breathe by her own.

She is happy and extremely thankful to the doctors for providing her with best treatment on time. She is not vaccinated yet. But soon will get a dose for herself and her family.
