



## Total Literacy in India by 2025: Rotary India Centennial Summit





A Skill Development program for 30,000 women of India

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Rotary in India kicked off its Centennial celebrations in Kolkata by showcasing its activities at a star-studded summit. The event saw the participation of some 4,000 delegates from 32 countries, including Rotary International President Mark Maloney, President Nominee Shekhar Mehta and several present and incoming RI Directors and Trustees.

Rotary began its journey in India from the city of Kolkata on Jan. 1, 1920 inspired by the organization's motto, "service above self". In the last 100 years, Rotary has grown from one club to 4000 with 1.5 lakh Rotary members in India.

The Summit was graced by the presence of Vice President of India, Venkaiah Naidu, Governor of West Bengal Jagdeep Dhankar, Union Ministers Gajendra Singh Sekhawat, Minister of Jal Shakti and Harsh Vardhan, Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India. The Chief Minister of West Bengal was represented by Amit Mitra, Minister for Finance & Excise, Commerce & Industries, Government of West Bengal. Eminent speakers representing their field of work took part in six areas of sustainable development. Rajashree Birla, Aditya Birla Group, Sandeep Talwar, CMO, Akshay Patra Foundation, Magsaysay Award winners - Rajendra Singh, Indian Water Conservationist and Environmentalist and Anshu Gupta, Founder Goonj Foundation shared their experiences from the field.

The summit plenary sessions on Fighting Disease, WASH and Environment, Polio, Growing Local Economies, Peace, Membership and Basic Education and Literacy focused on relevant aspects of the subject matter, the problems in the subjects and how to overcome them.



## **Basic Education and Literacy session**



The Basic Education and Literacy session started with the video presentation which showcased various literacy project pictures implemented by Rotarians across the country. Apart from focusing on various projects supporting education and literacy, the session also laid much emphasis on the T-E-A-C-H program. The session was graced by **Sri Shankar Maruwada**, Co-Founder, Ek-Step and Dr. Hrushikesh Senapaty, Director, NCERT.

# T-E-A-C-H in Action

## Initiatives taken by Clubs



## **Teacher Support**



**RC Ichalkaranji Central, RID 3170** organized teacher training which focused on the method of teaching and handling differently-abled children. 35 teachers were trained at the training session.



**RC** Ichalkaranji Central, RID 3170 organized teacher training program focusing on standard children psychology and ways of developing brainpower of children with parents.22 teachers were given training in this program.



**RC Ichalkaranji Central, RID 3170** organized teacher training program focusing on soft skills and proper usage of the English language for a specific purpose. 35 teachers were trained.



**RC Ramteerth, RID 3170** organized a teacher training session on Science subjects in association with Infosys Samarpana Trust. The participating teachers were handed over science kits during the training.



**RC Bijapur, RID 3170** conducted Teachers Training Programme for Teachers of government schools of Vijayapur district in association with District Institute of Education.



**RC Golaghat, RID 3240** conducted a teacher training workshop where the focus was on proper handling of textbook in the classroom and a modern approach towards teaching the English language.



RC Ahmednagar Priyadarshini, RID 3132 arranged a two-day teachers training program independently with the help of experts based on the syllabus suggested by RILM covering topics like Classroom Management, Life Skills, Creative pedagogy, Soft skills for teachers, Critical thinking and problem solving, Leadership and Personal development of students, Career guidance, Human Rights. Group activities and quiz were also conducted. Best teacher male and Best Teacher female, 3 Best school groups were chosen and prizes awarded.



RID 3132, RC Ahmednagar Priyadarshini conducted a 2-day Teacher Training workshop for 60 teachers from 9 government schools. The training was conducted on the following topics: Classroom management, Life Skills, Soft skills for teachers, Creative pedagogy, Critical thinking and problem-solving, Leadership and Personal development of students, Career guidance and Human Rights.



**RC Mumbai South, RID 3141** conducted online English training classes for 15 teachers.



**RC Adambakkam, RID 3232** conducted an Adult Literacy session where special coaching classes were given to teachers of Thanthai Periyar Higher Secondary School on how to use computers, MS Office, sending emails. This was conducted by Rtn Varadharajan from the Academic Center for Excellence. This was done to orient the teachers towards promoting a digital mode of teaching the students.



**RC Coimbatore Manchester, RID 3201** conducted teacher training for 3 days, where more than 60 teachers were trained. The training was on Effective ways of Teaching, Cybersecurity and role of a teacher.



**RC West Coast, RID 3141** conducted 2 days teacher training for 900 teachers-in two batches of 450 teachers in association with RILM teacher training partner Indian Career Education and Development Council. The training was given on simple lesson plan methodologies.



**RC Dahisar, RID 3141** organized two-day Teacher's Training exercise with a school in Parli, Mumbai. The training was conducted in association with Indian Career Education and Development Council. The workshop was very motivating and informative.



**RC Ujjain, RID 3040** organized a teacher training program in coordination with District Education Office. The training focused on motivating teacher towards using E-learning while teaching.



## E-learning



**RC Ramteerth, RID 3170** installed E-learning kits in 7 govt. schools benefitting 2,850 students from the 7 schools. The

hardware was provided by RILM's hardware partner Egate and Software from software partner Digilearn.



**RC Venugram-Belgaum, RID 3170** installed E-learning kit in a government school benefitting 310 students. Both the hardware and software were provided by Oxysmart.



**RC Hubli-East, RID 3170** installed E-learning kit at Rotary High School, Bengeri , Hubbali benefitting 440 students. Hardware provided by Oxysmart and software by Digilearn.



**RC Belgaum Midtown, RID 3170** installed projector-based E-learning kit at a government school benefitting more than 600 students. Software content was provided by Digilearn and hardware by Oxysmart.

**RC Kurundwad, RID 3170** has set up E-learning kit to a government school where software was provided by Classroom and Hardware by Oxysmart. The project is benefitting more than 500 students.





**RC Jamkhandi, RID 3170** has set up an E-learning system at Dr BR Ambedkar Residential Girls School. The project is benefitting more than 150 students. The hardware was provided by Oxysmart and software by Digilearn.



**RC Ranebennur, RID 3170** has set up an E-learning system at Rotary English Medium High School benefitting 429 students. Hardware was provided by Oxysmart and Software by Digilearn.



**RC Haveri, RID 3170** installed an E-learning system at JP Rotary School where Hardware and software were provided by Oxysmart and Digilearn. The project is benefitting 200 students.



**RC Bombay, RID 3141** provided E-learning kits to 12 government schools benefitting more than 2,000 students.



**RC Mumbai, RID 3141** South installed E-learning kits in 10 government schools benefitting more than 500 students.

**RC Ujjain, RID 3040** installed TV-based hardware kit in 47 government schools. The project was funded by National Thermal Power Corporation under RILM's E-Shiksha project. The TV was provided by Sony and Software was approved by Rajya Shiksha Kendra, Madhya Pradesh.






## Adult Literacy

#### **Adult Literacy Portal Launched**

A new restructured Adult Literacy portal has been launched by RILM at the Basic Education and Literacy session during the Rotary India Centennial Summit 2020. The portal will act as a repository for all information as far as Adult Literacy is concerned. The clubs who all are implementing the adult literacy program, they will be able to enroll their adult learners for the NIOS examination. The portal will act as a database of all the adult learners who all are being imparted



literacy through the RILM's Adult Literacy program. The portal will reside on Rotary TEACH website: www.rotaryteach.org and will go live soon..

#### Training of Brahmakumari Volunteers

As RILM has entered into a partnership with Brahmakumari's to implement Adult Literacy program, a training program was conducted by RILM for the volunteers of Brahmakumaris. These volunteers will teach non-literate adults. PDG Ramesh Chander, Chair Adult Literacy National Committee, PDG Ravi Langer- Adult Literacy National Committee member and advisor and Dr. Aapga Singh, COO, RILM had conducted the training program. More than 500 volunteers from Brahmakumaris had attended the training program. During the training, the volunteers were briefed about the literacy scenario of India and adult literacy data in India. The trainers also focused on the Swabhimaan program, the structure of the program along with the usage of the adult literacy toolkit.

#### **Adult Literacy Centers Started:**


**RC Green Land Silchar, RID 3240** in association with RCC Sanatan Unnayan Sangstha, has inaugurated three Adult Literacy Centre at the remote area of Elgin bagan area, Chengduar Basti and Chengduar Bagan area, 25 km from Silchar. More than 30 participants have enrolled their names in each of the centre.



**RC Allahabad East, RID 3120** has started their Swabhimaan centers with more than 10m adult learners.







For the second phase of the Asha Kiran program, RILM had published a call for proposal advertisement on www.devnetjobsindia and on RILM Facebook for implementation NGO.

The focus areas of implementation commencement are Karnataka, Telengana, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Delhi and West Bengal. In response to this advertisement RILM has received several expression of interest and 30 proposals from various NGOs all over the India.

#### Desk Appraisals of NGOs Asha Kiran proposal:

The Child Development team reviewed the proposals submitted by various NGOs for Asha Kiran project Implementation. This process is called Desk level review or desk appraisals. Under this process RILM validates all parameters like rationale, geographical area wise need, budget viabilities etc. mentioned in the proposals.



## Happy School



**RC Ichalkaranji Central, RID 3170** transformed New High School Shivakwadi and Modern Vidhyaniketan Alate into Happy Schools by fulfilling all the criteria for a Happy School. More than 400 students are benefitting from this project.



**RC Bangalore Orchards, RID 3190** converted 9 government schools into Happy School by providing all basic amenities under the Happy School project. The project is benefitting more than 1,000 students.



**RC Gandhimanagar, RID 3201** converted Government High School, Gandhimanagar into a Happy School by providing all basic amenities to the school. More than 300 students are benefitting from this project.



**RC** Ahmednagar Priyadarshi, RID 3132 transformed Panchasil Vidya Mandir into a Happy School after facilitating the schools with all basic amenities like Desks and Benches, gender specific toilet, furniture and other basic requisites for a school. More than 400 students are benefitting from this project.



**RC Hanamkonda, RID 3150** converted 13 government schools into Happy Schools by fulfilling all basic criteria for Happy School.More than 2,000 students are benefitting from this project.



**RC Secunderabad West, RID 3150** took up a target to convert 181 government schools into Happy Schools by providing all the required infrastructure like gender specific toilets, benches and desks, clean drinking water , Hand Washing stations , Play material, books for library etc. The club has already implemented the project in15 schools and are seeking to finish the remaining project through a Global Grant.

## A bench to sit on... and many more!

Lakshmi is a student of class V, GKHPS Maruvemane School in Kolar District, Karnataka. She is super happy to get a bench to sit on and she breaks into a smile. The credit of her smile goes to Rotary Club of Bangalore Orchards, RID 3190. The club took a great





initiative to convert this government school into a happy school under the T-E-A-C-H program.

Rotary Club of Bangalore Orchards stepped into this tiny school in suburbs of Bangalore. They constructed gender specific toilets and wash facilities, installed drinking water facility, renovated classrooms, supplied proper playing materials and age specific seating arrangements. The school has around 79

students and 4 teaching staff. Located in a tiny village, the facilities did not necessarily inspire children to come to school every single day. Happily though, that is no longer the scenario in this small school. It boasts of cheerful and committed students and teachers who work together to make the learning experience a fun-filled activity.

Happy School vertical of the T-E-A-C-H program have always been a favourite pick amongst the Rotarians and Rotary Clubs. Till today, RILM has successfully transformed 3,098 government schools into Happy Schools across the country. The projects have benefitted millions of students and teachers.

**Vision 2025:** To transform 1,500 schools into Happy Schools each year, thus achieving a total of 7,500 schools across India. The starting point could be creating 2,500 libraries every year, which would help identify the other needs of these schools and turn them to Happy Schools.

# Ambuja Cement Foundation & Malabar Hill Rotary Foundation jointly transforms 30 schools

Rotary Club of Malabar Hill through its Malabar Hill Foundation provided fund for painting 30 government schools located in Jiwati District, Maharashtra. Thus, these 30 schools were transformed into Happy Schools.

Under the Padho Bharat initiative, which aims to create libraries across India, RILM through Rotary and Inner Wheel clubs have successfully set up 1, 202 libraries across the country using the 3.75 lakh books worth Rs. 5 Crore received as donation from Orient Black Swan. In the last 6 months, 337 libraries have been created.
